Rowena Rowley, Office for Students

Rowena is Head of Provider Governance. She oversees compliance with conditions of registration relating to management and governance. This covers areas such as protecting public funding, the Prevent duty, the C conditions of registration, funding assurance, and providers that are exempt charities.

Will Dent, Office for Students

Will is Head of Financial Sustainability. He leads the organisation's intelligence on the financial sustainability of higher education providers. He is an expert in financial sustainability, financial analysis, corporate governance and risk management and has had many years' experience working closely with government departments including Department for Education (DFE), Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) and HM Treasury.

Stephanie Harris, Universities UK

Stephanie is currently the Director of Strategy, Insight and Member Engagement at Universities UK (UUK), the representative body for UK universities where she has worked for 7 years in various roles. In her current role, she acts as a senior adviser to the CEO and makes sure UUK's work is driven by and for its membership.
